Scheduled maintenance slot

Increased storage space for researchers

Associate Professor Thomas Franz's work focuses primarily on computational modelling in cellular mechanobiology as well as the treatment and prevention of cardiovascular diseases. He and his research group create large volumes of data. After taking up his position as Head of the Department of Human Biology in the Faculty of Health Sciences, he started looking for affordable, secure, easily accessible storage.

"The eResearch Centre provided me with an easy and convenient solution for storage of my group's data without the need to procure any hardware myself. So far, we have used the space

provided mainly for storage and backups of my entire research group" said Franz.

Realising a need existed for large volume secure storage, ICTS increased their central storage



and offered it to researchers. This is just one of the services offered by the newly established UCT eResearch Centre.

Since then, 20 departments and research groups have already been allocated storage space with over 635 terabytes already in use.

Getting your hands on storage space for your research is as easy as logging a call with the IT Helpdesk and providing a motivation for consideration. Space is currently allocated at R3600 per terabyte.

UCT increases its international Internet bandwidth

Our Internet Service Provider, TENET, has negotiated a reduced

price in international bandwidth for South African universities on both the WACS and Seacom cables.

This discounted rate, means that UCT was able to increase its bandwidth on the WACS cable to 1.230Gbps, and reduce its usage of the more expensive SEACOM cable.
