Mountain Lion and Windows 8 testing commences

Whenever vendors release new versions of their operating systems or software, ICTS conducts product suitability testing to ensure that these products do not conflict with the software already in use on campus.

We are currently testing the latest Apple operating system, Mac OS X 10.8 (Mountain Lion), which was released in July and, even though Microsoft's Windows

field of business process management (BPM), was aimed at gaining an understanding of the competencies and skills required in individuals to become efficient business process analysts. Their results were used to develop a pyramid model for competencies, detailing what skills and qualities were required at which levels in the industry. They propose that this model could be useful for systems educators when designing curricula.

Thembela feels that there is still a huge knowledge gap in the field of process analysis in South Africa and she is now applying for her Master's Degree to further her research. She says without the support and understanding of her mentor Lisa Seymour she would never have come this far, and she feels that the award is a great validation of all the hard work they have put into their research over the past year.

The new Governance Intranet facilitates the management of committee documents

Have you ever wondered what is discussed in committee meetings across campus? Or have you ever struggled to find the latest Principal's Circular? The new Governance Intranet provides secure, authenticated role-based access to both open and closed committees. It also hosts UCT policies and Principal's Circulars.

In early July, all UCT committee chairs and servicing officers were invited to attend the launch meetings, hosted by the Registrar, where the basic functionality was demonstrated. The easy-to-use site allows servicing officers to effortlessly maintain, manage

and distribute minutes, agendas and any other committee documents to members of their respective committees. The site makes use of automated triggers that will either send reminders to servicing officers, inform committee members that the minutes are available for viewing, or inform policy owners that their



policies are up for review. The Governance Intranet provides a secure central location for all official UCT governance documentation and provides the mechanisms for ensuring that they remain up-to-date.

All servicing officers on campus are urged to start using the Governance Intranet to store their committee documentation. Before being granted access to the site, however, they will need to attend one of the full-day training sessions offered by ICTS. UCT staff members who are neither servicing officers, committee members or policy owners don't need to undergo any training and can simply log on to the site to view open committee documents, policies and Principal's circulars. To access the Governance Intranet site, navigate to http://governance.uct.ac.za and log on using your UCT username@wf and password.

How to prepare for your move to Outlook



Take me home, Google!

Google is attempting to get you home quicker by providing regular traffic updates in and around Cape Town, Johannesburg and Pretoria. "How?" you may ask. The Internet search engine has made a traffic layer available that you can select when accessing

Google Maps. South Africa is just 1 one of a number of countries that has access to this useful service. You can even view the traffic layer on your mobile device by installing the Google Maps app.

Once the traffic layer is selected, a shade of green, yellow or red will appear on the map you are

currently viewing. Green shows that traffic is free-flowing, while red indicates slow moving traffic. In some cases, if you click Get Directions and then insert your To and From destinations, you will get a rough estimate of how long your journey will take. How cool is that?

So the next time you miss the traffic update on the radio, just log on to Google Maps and see what the traffic is like on the route you take.
