Student IT survey results

To better understand students' ICT needs we conducted a Student IT Survey on Vula from 15 April to 2 May. The 2378 responses we received have provided useful information that will allow us to address any service gaps. Here is a snippet of the data collected. Of the students surveyed:


- 43% own large screen notebooks and 83% use the Windows Operating System.
- 54% use Faculty Labs and 25% use the Library to access Internet on campus.
- 86% use their Internet quota for academic and personal use.
- 76% are generally happy using their UCT mailbox.
- 77% say their courses make use of Vula.

Spring clean your computer

Here are three easy ways you can "spring clean" your computer to improve its performance:





- 2. Defrag your drives. The defrag tool re-organises the data on your hard drive and frees up extra space that will make it easier for your computer to find your data faster. Select Start | All Programs | Accessories | System Tools | Disk Defragmenter. Select a Volume such as your C: drive and click Defragment. Depending on the amount of data you have on your drive/s this may take some time to complete so we recommend that you leave it to run overnight.
- Clear your cache. Every time you visit a new website, content is stored in your Temporary Internet Files folder (or cache), You

should regularly clear out the cache by opening ${\bf Internet}$ Explorer and clicking Tools | Internet Options | General. Under Browser History click Delete (twice) and then OK. In ${f Firefox}$ version 2, click Tools | Options | Privacy | Cache | Clear Cache Now and then OK. In Firefox version 3 and 3.5, click on Tools | Options | Advanced | Network. Next to Offline storage, click Clear Now and then OK.

Hiddingh wireless link upgrade

On 1 September, ICTS commissioned a 16Mbps full-duplex point-to-point wireless link between Hiddingh and Upper Campus. This has significantly improved the speed of access to services such as GroupWise, iPrint, SAP, online UCT Library resources and the Internet.
